## **Telematics discount – Is it right for you?**

This is an auto insurance discount program offered by the insurance carrier where you plug a device into your car or you register within a mobile application for a period of time, typically 3-6 months, and it tracks your mileage and driving skills. That data is used to generate an additional discount up to 40%.

Telematics is a term that combines the words telecommunications and informatics to broadly describe the integrated use of communications and information technology to transmit, store and receive information from the telecommunication devices.

## Why are carriers offering this?

They are trying to identify and reward safe drivers with the assumption that if the results are positive the element of distracted driving is a reduced exposure. Make no mistake, distracted driving is a major profitability issue and carriers are trying to weed people out who are practicing distracting driving.

## **Important points:**

- It measures miles driven, hard braking, fast acceleration, night driving (midnight to 5 am) and lane usage.
- You get a 5% discount for just participating in the program.
- The carrier must protect your privacy. They cannot sell or use any information gathered in this program to a third party. (Example: If you drive by a Starbucks every morning you won't get solicitations from Starbucks)
- It can be done on a per vehicle basis. You don't have to enroll all of your vehicles.
- At this moment the results can only lower your auto insurance costs. If the results are poor your rates stay the same and you keep the 5% participation discount. Once your results are set the carrier can't take them away.
- If you know you are a poor driver or you can't be "good" for 3-6 months than don't do this program. •
- Pick a 3 month window where you are not driving the vehicle on a long trip.
- If you have a vehicle that has low annual miles you for sure want to enroll that vehicle.
